## SENEGAL PROJECT

The CNET/Lannion HF radar has been financed by the Ministry of Cooperation; it should be set up and operated in Senegal.

#### KORHOGO SITE

The LETTI HF radar should be set up at Korhogo during the second quarter of 1996. Mr Olivier Chiron (VSN) will take office in replacement of Mr Patrick Merrien in March 1996.
